Give Well **Encouraging Your Child to Give**

When we encourage our kids to give, they're more likely to help others. Circle three or four ways your child could give, with your encouragement.

GIVE MONEY TO A SCHOOL FUNDRAISER.

Clean out a closet and give away gently used items to charity.

Bake cookies or some other treat to bring to someone who needs cheering up.

give money to your church, synagogue, or temple.

Clean out your garage, basement, or attic and give away things you no longer use.

DRAW PICTURES OR CREATE GREETING CARDS TO SEND TO PEOPLE WHO ARE SICK.

Give money to a community fundraiser.

Go through old toys and donate gently used toys to charity.

Have your child call a grandparent who hasn't heard from him or her in a while.

Give money to a cause your child believes in.

Go through clothes that no longer fit your child and give them to charity.

See if your child can help a teacher, coach, club leader, or neighbor with a project.

GIVE MONEY TO A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION THAT YOUR CHILD LIKES.

Make it a rule that if your child receives a gift or buys something new he or she needs to give something else away.
