4. Closing price	<u> C </u>	D. One part of an investment. The stock or mutual fund is divided equally. What an investor purchases.
5. Stock	<u> G </u>	E. A mixture of investments that represent a number of different companies and/or types of businesses.
6. Investor	<u> B </u>	F. Where most stocks of major U.S. companies are traded.
7. Net worth of a stock	<u> H </u>	G. An investment of shares directly in a specific company or corporation.
